Nautilus International Holding Corp. has announced the appointment of Greg Barker as the new vice president of environmental, health & safety.



In his role, Barker will work in partnership with the operations groups and organizational leadership to develop a safety program that focuses on injury, incident and severity rate reduction while concurrently fostering a safety culture that drives meaningful and sustainable progress.

“It’s rare to be given an opportunity to join a well-established team with a proven track record of success and an organization filled with people committed to the success of its stakeholders,” Barker said. “I gladly accept the invitation to join the Metro Ports team and look forward to the challenges, opportunities and accomplishments that lie ahead of us.”

Barker joins the Metro team after serving in the safety capacity since 2005. He most recently held the role of vice president of health, safety & environmental (HS&E) for Ports America. In his tenure, Barker was involved with the design and implementation of numerous HS&E programs including the development and administration of the Reasonable Suspicion Assessment (RSA) program. Most notably, the RSA program led to an 82 percent incident report rate increase and a 47 percent reduction to Port America’s workers compensation cost since 2008.

Prior to his nearly 15 years with Ports America, Barker gained unique experience through law enforcement, loss prevention, and insurance fraud management making him an unparalleled leader in the development and implementation of programs designed to mitigate workplace risks.

His pervasive experience in the maritime realm extending from the West, Gulf and Atlantic Coasts and extensive knowledge in diverse operations such as cruise, break bulk, Ro-Ro, and military has made him a valued source in multiple committees pertaining to HS&E issues. Today, Barker is a board member of the National Maritime Safety Association and previously was a board member of EXP, formerly known as the International Trade Education Program.

Barker’s passion for advocacy is prevalent in his personal life as well. For over 20 years, he has served as a mentor and coach in multiple youth sports organizations throughout the Redondo Beach and Manhattan Beach areas.
